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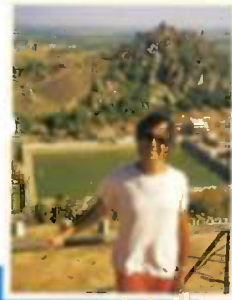

In Tucson they hold an amazing gem fair that's like one long party; the people are insane. I go on holiday to Ibiza most years; I have lots of friends there, and I love the beaches on nearby Formentera. I also go to Barbados, where my mother and sister live. It has changed enormously over the years – it's so flashy now – though the east coast is still lovely. For future jewellery trips I would love to go to Brazil for crystals, and Madagascar for fossils and minerals.

● **What sparked your interest in jewellery?** Pebble began nine years ago, as a way of justifying my trips to India. I had become fascinated by tribal and Indian art while touring the USA when I was in a band, then on a holiday in Kerala I fell in love with the place. After a trip to Jaipur I was hooked. They have such a wealth of stones – initially I was very taken with white agate and chalcedony.

● **What is your design philosophy?** You can't beat nature. My philosophy is not to design, but to choose the cut and keep it simple. Stones are at their most beautiful when they are in their natural raw state.

● **Most memorable finds?** I love the beetle wings from Thailand which I've made into necklaces: the intensity of the colour is incredible. Some dowry jewellery from a tribe in south-west China is extraordinary; the necklaces are too heavy to wear, but make amazing sculptures. Just arrived are some necklaces made of camel's teeth – always a talking point! And in Jatujak Weekend Market I bought a whole sack of woven wicker balls to make into necklaces – the stallholders thought it was hysterical.

● **Favourite shops?** Egg boutique in London (36 Kinnerton Street, SW1; 020 7235 9315); the Gem Palace in Jaipur (www.gempalacejaipur.com), for obvious reasons:

● **Collaborations?** I've made jewellery for the Harry Potter films – they thought the large seed necklaces were perfect for the witches – and for Star Wars films. I've worked with Nicole Farhi, Roberto Cavalli, Matthew Williamson, Stephen Jones for John Galiano, and Alexander McQueen.
